Faculty

Students

Muhlenberg students are drawn largely from the Middle Atlantic and New England states, although approximately 30 states and over a dozen foreign countries are represented within the student body. The students also represent a variety of academic and extracurricular interests. The college selects students who give evidence of strong scholastic achievement, seriousness of purpose, and the capacity to make constructive contributions to the college community.

Academic Integrity Code

Muhlenberg College highly values academic honesty and integrity. Thus, Muhlenberg students share the responsibility for maintaining these high standards and must pledge themselves to abide by the Academic Integrity Code. This code, which embraces all areas and activities of the academic life of the College, stands as an emblem of the personal integrity and honest dealing which Muhlenberg expects from each of its students.

Honorary Societies

Muhlenberg College is one of 286 leading colleges and universities in the United States authorized to maintain a chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, the nation's oldest and most widely known academic honor society. Muhlenberg also houses twelve other national honorary societies.

Academic Support Services

The Academic Support Center, open to all students, aims at all areas of a student's academic lifestyle, from study skills to test anxiety. The Center fosters the development of "learning to learn" skills, provides free tutoring in all subject areas, and provides individual academic assistance ranging from special support for learning disabled students to seminars on such topics as Test Taking, Time Management and Textbook Reading.

Library Resources

Muhlenberg's Trexler Library resources include over 310,000 volumes and 29,000 print and electronic journals, as well as state-of-the-art electronic connectivity. An interlibrary loan program makes over 1.75 million books available to Muhlenberg students with daily delivery to campus.

Residential Life

Approximately 95% of Muhlenberg's full-time students reside in College housing. Students who enter as freshmen are provided with housing throughout their four years at Muhlenberg, choosing from one of the options listed below:

Retention/Graduation Rates

Muhlenberg enjoys very high retention and graduation rates. The freshman-to-sophomore retention rate for the class entering Fall 2014 was 93.2%. The 4-year graduation rate for the past three graduating classes has averaged 80.7%.

Career Planning & Placement

The Career Center provides a variety of services, including career counseling, job search strategies, job referral services, on-line recruiting, and on-campus recruiting by representatives of business, industry and the government.

Admission

Muhlenberg College is one of over 600 selective colleges and universities which subscribe to the Common Application. Students wishing to be considered for admission must submit a completed Common Application form, with the personal essay included. The applicant should request that his or her high school submit an official transcript, counselor's recommendation, and one teacher reference. Submission of SAT or ACT scores is optional. *An interview is strongly recommended and required for students who choose not to submit test scores.*

Financial Aid

Muhlenberg College endeavors to make its educational opportunities available to all qualified students regardless of their financial circumstances. While the majority of Muhlenberg's financial aid is available on a "need basis" as determined by the CSS Financial Aid PROFILE and Free Federal Form (FAFSA), the College also offers a number of merit scholarships each year (valued from \$1,000 to \$40,000 per year). Typically, over 80% of Muhlenberg's students qualify for and receive merit or need-based financial aid.
