In recent decades, Jewish and Christian scholars have been collaborating more and more. Indeed, it is not an exaggeration to say that the level of interaction has reached historically unprecedented levels. What are the boundaries between my Jewish or Christian identity and my commenting on or critiquing the traditions or actions of the other community? 3:30 **Session 3**: The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and Inter-religious Relations in 2019 Rev. Dr. Darrell Jodock, ELCA Panel on Lutheran-Jewish Relations Kathryn Mary Lohre, ELCA Executive, Ecumenical & Inter-Religious Relations

2019 is the 25th anniversary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's <u>Declaration to the Jewish Community</u> repudiating Martin Luther's anti-Jewish invective and expressing the church's desire to "live our faith with love and respect for the Jewish people." In August 2019, the Church-wide Assembly of the ELCA built on this and other church-wide policy statements by passing <u>A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment</u>. This session will give an overview of the broader interfaith life of the ELCA, and how the particular Jewish-Lutheran relationship informs the church's engagement with other religious communities.
