ALUMNI PROFILE CATHERINE SCHWARTZ '11

Without a doubt, engagement in the Jewish community through Muhlenberg College Hillel was part of the path that led Catherine Schwartz '11 to a fulfilling career in Jewish nonprofits.

"It was at Muhlenberg that I made the decision to become a Jewish professional. My time at Hillel greatly impacted me as a person, and as a Jew. I wanted to be able to give to others a similar experience," said Catherine, the project manager for two teams at The Jewish Education Project in New York City.

At The Jewish Education Project, Catherine works with the congregational education team and on a grant to develop Jewish enrichment programming for students attending Hebrew Language Charter Schools.

"I believe in this work because I believe that being Jewish is an important part of my identity. The culture, traditions and more have been passed down for so many generations that I think it is important to continue to engage people (especially kids and young adults) to show them the richness of this history, and the importance of being engaged Jewishly. I want to be a part of the narrative that is working to engage people in new ways and come up with innovative solutions to ongoing challenges within Jewish communities and the world," she said.

The media & communication major and Jewish studies minor recently completed a dual-masters from New York University in public administration and Hebrew and Judaic studies. While at NYU, she ran a 20s/30s group at a synagogue, staffed and recruited for Jewish summer teen tours (BBYO Passport), coordinated a program for Israeli students to come to New York and taught Hebrew School.

Prior to starting graduate school, Catherine worked as the program director for Hillels of Westchester and spent summers as the CIT-TWO director at Pinemere Camp. The common denominator of Catherine's work is that all of her roles have focused on improving and strengthening the Jewish community.

STUDENT PROFILE BIRTHRIGHT ALUM SAMANTHA ROSENFIELD '18

For Samantha Rosenfield '18, a Birthright trip to Israel opened her eyes to the array of opportunities for involvement and connection within Muhlenberg College Hillel.

"When I was a prospective student, one of the things I liked about Muhlenberg was the Jewish population," said the dance major, who is also pursuing education certification. "I had previously lived in St. Louis in an area with almost no Jews, so a Jewish community was something I wanted."

During her first year on campus, however, Samantha was still figuring out where she fit in. "I joined a few organizations, did an internship and went to some Friday night dinners at Hillel, but I was still figuring out what I wanted to dive into," she said.

In February of her freshman year, Samantha noticed that Muhlenberg College Hillel was planning a Birthright trip to Israel, and she didn't waste any time signing up. The trip proved transformational. While she knew no one else going on the trip, she jumped in enthusiastically, quickly bonding with others.

"What was eye-opening to me is that in Israel, Judaism is as much about the culture as it is about the religion. I really enjoyed that, along with connecting with individuals that I may not have otherwise known." Samantha said.

The Birthright trip was only the beginning for Samantha. She has since become the head of publicity and communications for Muhlenberg College Hillel's student board and a Hillel engagement intern. She has also represented Hillel at events such as June Advising Days for incoming students.

"It was the Birthright trip that pulled me in to Muhlenberg College Hillel," Samantha said. "It is the great people and staff that keep me coming back."



FOSTERING **EMERGING JEWISH LEADERS**

ISRAEL FELLOW

Muhlenberg College Hillel continues to partner with Hillel International and The Jewish Agency for Israel to welcome an Israel Fellow to campus each year. The Israel Fellow creates and leads unique and innovative strategy for Israel engagement and education, and to help link students to Israel experiences such as 10-day trips to Israel on Birthright, summer-long internship through Onward Israel and study abroad on four College-approved university programs. Thanks to the generosity of an alumni donor, Muhlenberg College Hillel welcomed Liron Daniel as its second Israel Fellow for the 2016-2017 school year. The Israel Fellow works hand-in-hand with Muhlenberg College Hillel's professionals on campus, supporting students and helping them to grapple with complex issues as they develop a lifelong connection to Israel and a sense of global Jewish peoplehood.

EZRA FELLOW

Through a partnership with Hillel International, Muhlenberg College Hillel has hired a program and engagement associate who serves as an Ezra Fellow, participating in a national fellowship program for top Jewish leaders and educators. The Ezra Fellow is empowered to use her own Jewish experiences to incorporate Jewish thought into daily conversations with students, whether in formal programs or casually over coffee. Innovative engagement through education program has helped make Jewish learning accessible and meaningful to our students.

ENGAGEMENT INTERNS

Muhlenberg College Hillel is beginning its inaugural year of Engagement Interns, a national program that builds Jewish life on campus through peer-to-peer engagement, community building initiatives, and Jewish learning. Student engagement interns tap their personal social networks (greek life, business majors, foodies, artists) to connect friends and friends of friends to each other, and to help freshmen feel connected to Jewish life on campus. They learn to build authentic relationships, create new Jewish experiences, expand communities, and impart sophisticated and relevant Jewish content.


