

WHAT CAN I EXPECT IN MY FIRST YEAR?

When you meet with your Summer Advisor, the two of you will discuss your theatre interests, experiences, and goals for the future. You'll also talk a bit about first-year classes you will take, and kinds of classes you might take — both in the Theatre Program and in the General Academic Requirements.

FALL – THR 105: PERFORMANCE & SOCIETY

SPRING – THR 107: **DRAMATIC TEXT IN ACTION**

THE CUE STUDIO

Culminating Undergraduate Experience
